Top 5 Sustainable Development Goals













This year, **Partnerships for the Goals** joined our top five with 35 projects matching. This moved Reduced Inequalities to 6th place, and Responsible Consumption and **Production** to 7th place.

Mapping against each SDGs and their targets

This year we mapped 63 of our current projects against the SDGs and their targets: aligning to 16/17 SDGs, and 80/169 targets.

Most Significant Changes



Our largest number of programs matched to SDG Targets 2.1, 3.4 and 4.7.

This is due to an increase of educational projects [4.7] that relate to sustainable development and lifestyles, and of the diverse cultures's contribution to sustainable development, particularly as part of our Grant Funded program Hear Me, See Me, Employ Me.





The increased access to nutritious and culturally appropriate food particularly those who are more vulnerable [2.1], as part of our Local Project and Grant Funded, Food Insecurity and Collaborative Gardens program. his program grows food for food literacy and develops social connections and involves Coburg North Primary School, Collingwood College and Burwood Brickworks. This then benefits supply of culturally appropriate fresh food to communities and projects for those who are at risk or vulnerable, ongoing shared maintenance, and the shared use of the space for delivery of upskilling, workshops, and other projects that develop community and social connection and mental wellbeing [3.4] as well as additional therapeutic, occupational health and curriculum outcomes


A key project that has contributed to Goal 17 joining our Top 5 Goals has been our partnership with Burwood Brickworks, Burwood Rooftop Farm - this project supports diverse communities to build skills, increase social connection through community engagement and the supply of culturally appropriate fresh food and projects

Goal 17 had the most increase of alignment of initiatives due to new Multi-Stakeholder Partnerships

Observing the past year

The alignment of SDGs to our programs has reduced as we have streamlined projects to fit our current three year strategy [2022-2025]. We have operated in a post COVID-19 world and explored more efficient, effective and collaborative ways of working through maintaining and strengthening core activities and community-led approach.

Although the decrease, we did observe an 8.3% [14] increase of SDG Targets being met. Our new reporting of Green Corporate Governance [GCG] and Environmental, Social and Corporate Governance data [ESG]has also helped to support SDG Goals 6 and 7 for first time and with investment next year will help provide new data, guidance and information.
